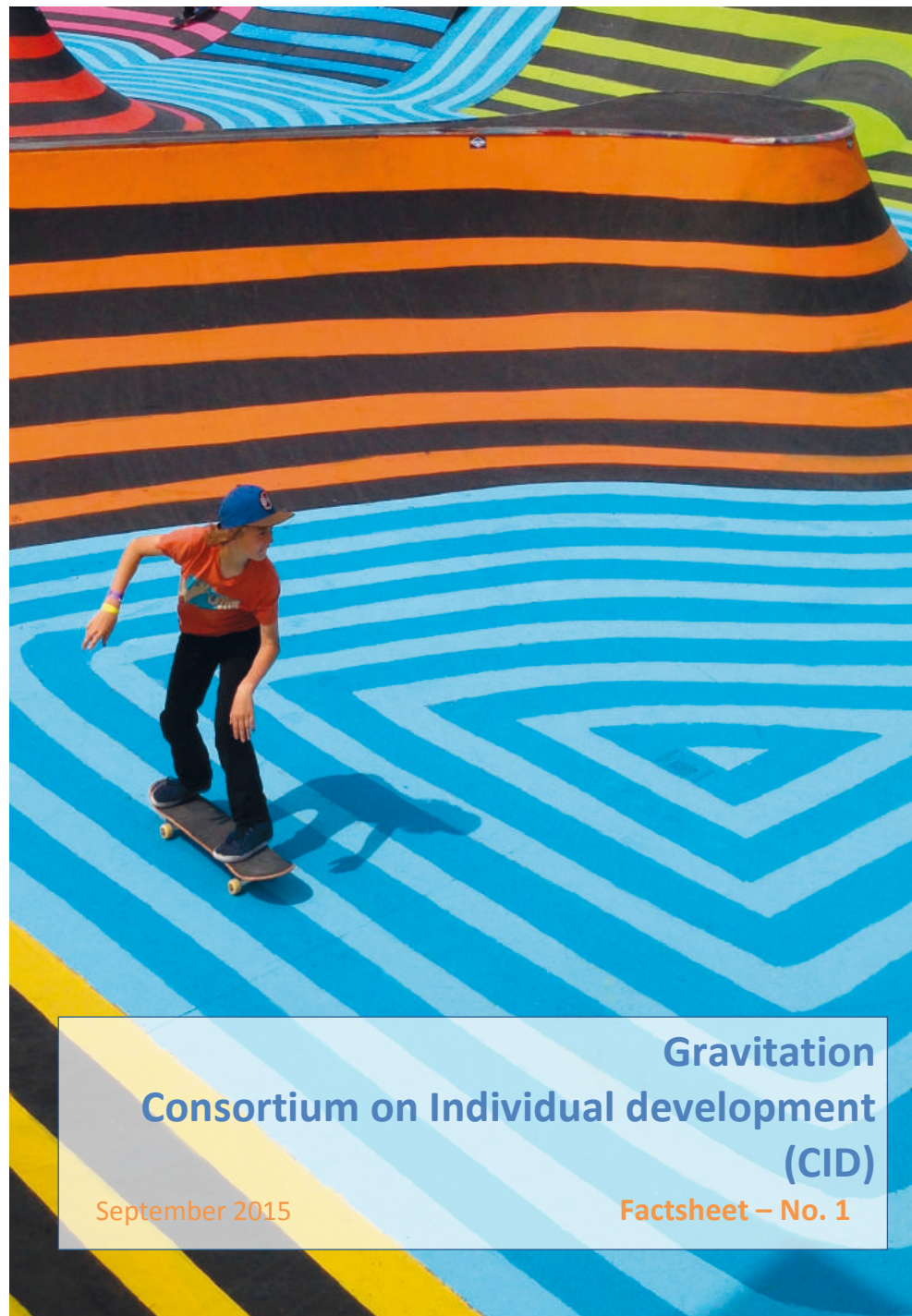

On April 9 and 10, 2015 we organized the second Scientific Advisory Board (SAB) meeting and CID symposium.
